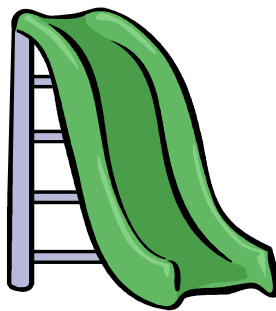

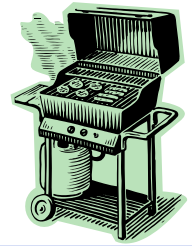

Keystone Torch Club-Teen Program

The Boys and Girls Club of Lewistown is proud to announce Keystone and Torch Club, a FREE teen oriented program that focuses on leadership and prevention. Using SMART moves, the evidence based prevention curriculum, created by Boys and Girls Club of America, seventh through twelfth grade teenagers will learn how to avoid and resist engaging in risky behaviors and immediate threats to their well-being such as alcohol, tobacco, other drugs and teen pregnancy. The program provides age-appropriate information, skills and techniques needed for youth to adopt the attitudes and behaviors necessary to lead healthy, fulfilling lives. SMART moves will teach teens the importance of being a responsible young adult and how to make healthy choices.
